It is my distinguished honour to be here today, at the official hand over of a clinic which was built by **Imery Gecko**Okandjande Mining (Pty) Ltd.

Allow me to give you a reflection of how this journey started. In 2016, we gathered at this very place with some of the mining companies to witness the handing over of a school hostel facility of the Olukupa Combined School. At that time, the hostel facility was constructed by a Section

21 Company known as the Small Miners of Uis (SMU), which operates under the patronage of the Ministry of Mines and Energy.

This means that the SMU, is a not for profit company. Also at the same event in 2016, during the handover of the hostel facility. Dundee Precious Metal pledge to donation of N\$ 30,000.00. In the same light, Ohorongo Cement pledged a donation of about 200 bags of cement and B2gold pledge to donate N\$ 30,000 in addition to their donation, B2Gold further pledged to take a number of learners on an excursion trip to the mine. At that time a local company called Nam-Uis also donated an N\$5000.00.

Just as I thought the event had come to an end, a very charismatic man, warm-hearted and kind in nature stood up and said; "I also want to pledge". I looked at him and he was barefoot, on this very ground.

He pledge to construct a clinic for the Olukupa community. This man, who showed a readiness to give more than what was expected is none other than Mr. J. P.

Smit from Imery Gecko Okandjande Mining. And he is here today with us to handover this good yield.

I am informed that all the pledges and donations were receive by the Olukupa Combined School as promised. It is against this background that today, we are here to witness the handover of the clinic made possible by **Gecko Mining** as part of their corporate social responsibility, with the aim to assist government in its quest of eradicating poverty.

The clinic consist of two consulting rooms, two screening rooms, a waiting area, and a cashier office as well as an accommodation section for the nurse. In addition Gecko installed a solar water pump, an extra water tank and a sewage pond for the school.

Ladies and Gentlemen,

The Ministry of Mines and Energy has taken the responsibility to engage and mobilise mining companies to channel their (CSR) corporate social responsibility programmes to far and outlying areas where there are no mining activities. Thus, it is the Ministry desire to see CSR programmes for mines, being extended to non-mining localities. Such
